

Outcomes

The SIRD Programme aims to contribute to five outcomes,

7844 outcomes were reported

Outcome 1: **956** people and carers are better prepared, confident to engage and contribute meaningfully to social care assessments and reviews.

Outcome 2: **3096** people and carers feel more informed, listened to, less stressed.

Outcome 3: **1878** people and carers can creatively and flexibly plan to achieve personal outcomes including accessing community assets.

Outcome 5: **1914** people and carers have increased knowledge and understanding of self-directed support principles and options for social care.
