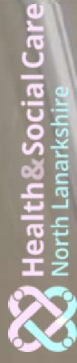

For the Community Solutions Consortium in Cumbarnauld and the North Area to be effective in enabling citizens to live safe, healthy and independent lives, it is recognised that first the partnership must establish its own comprehensive working framework, detailing a blueprint to base development on.

Building Foundations for Strong Local and National Outcomes

Identifying the outcome framework which has enabled potentially impactful Development Plan activities to be designed

Health and Social Care North Lanarkshire's Strategic Commissioning Plan 2023-26 has a central focus of ensuring that all provisions and policy are shaped around nine national health and wellbeing outcomes (listed right) designated by Scottish Government. Saliiently, these aims are the bedrock of the Community Solutions structure in North Lanarkshire.

In this respect, to ensure that our Consortium operates accordingly, the 40 activities outlined in this Plan (five under each of the eight spheres created) have been mapped out to contribute to the national health and wellbeing outcomes. How and in what way

each activity plays a role to what outcomes is illustrated under each sphere's 'main outcome focus area' component on pages 4-11.

Equally, an essential element of this Plan is delivering for the benefit of three target groups sought to be the prime beneficiaries of the Community Solutions programme, namely adults, carers and children, young people and families. In this context, there are a related nine Community Solutions-specific outcomes (displayed below right) which form the nucleus of the spheres and activities featured in this Plan, with key performance indicators and strategic plan contributions referenced.

Nine National Health and Wellbeing Outcomes

OUTCOME 1 (Wellbeing)

People are able to look after and improve their own health and wellbeing and live in good health for longer

OUTCOME 2 (Independence)

People, including those with disabilities or long term conditions, or who are frail, are able to live, as far as reasonably practicable, independently in a homely setting in their community

OUTCOME 3 (Experience)

People who use health and social care services have positive experiences of those services and are respected

OUTCOME 4 (Quality)

Health and social care services are centred on helping to maintain or improve the quality of life of people who use those services, including people with existing health conditions

OUTCOME 5 (Inequalities)

Health and social care services contribute to reducing health inequalities and removing barriers

OUTCOME 6 (Carers)

People who provide unpaid care are supported to look after their own health and wellbeing, including to reduce any negative impact of their caring role on their own health and wellbeing

OUTCOME 7 (Safety)

People using health and social care services are safe from harm with protection an underpinning priority

OUTCOME 8 (Engagement)

People who work in health and social care services feel engaged with the work they do and are supported to continuously improve the information, support, care and treatment they offer

OUTCOME 9 (Resources)

Resources are used effectively and efficiently in the provision of health and social care for the benefit of users

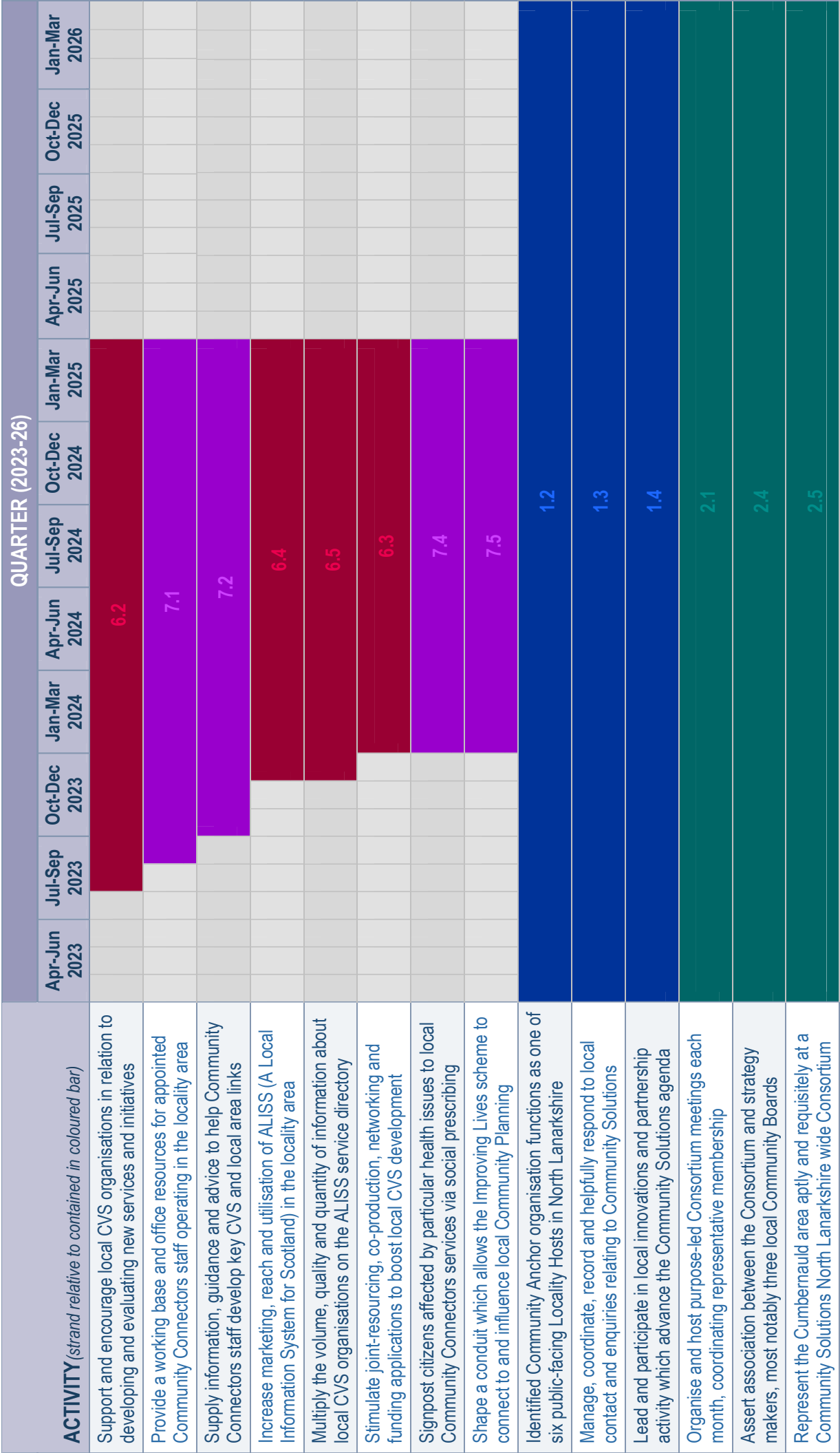

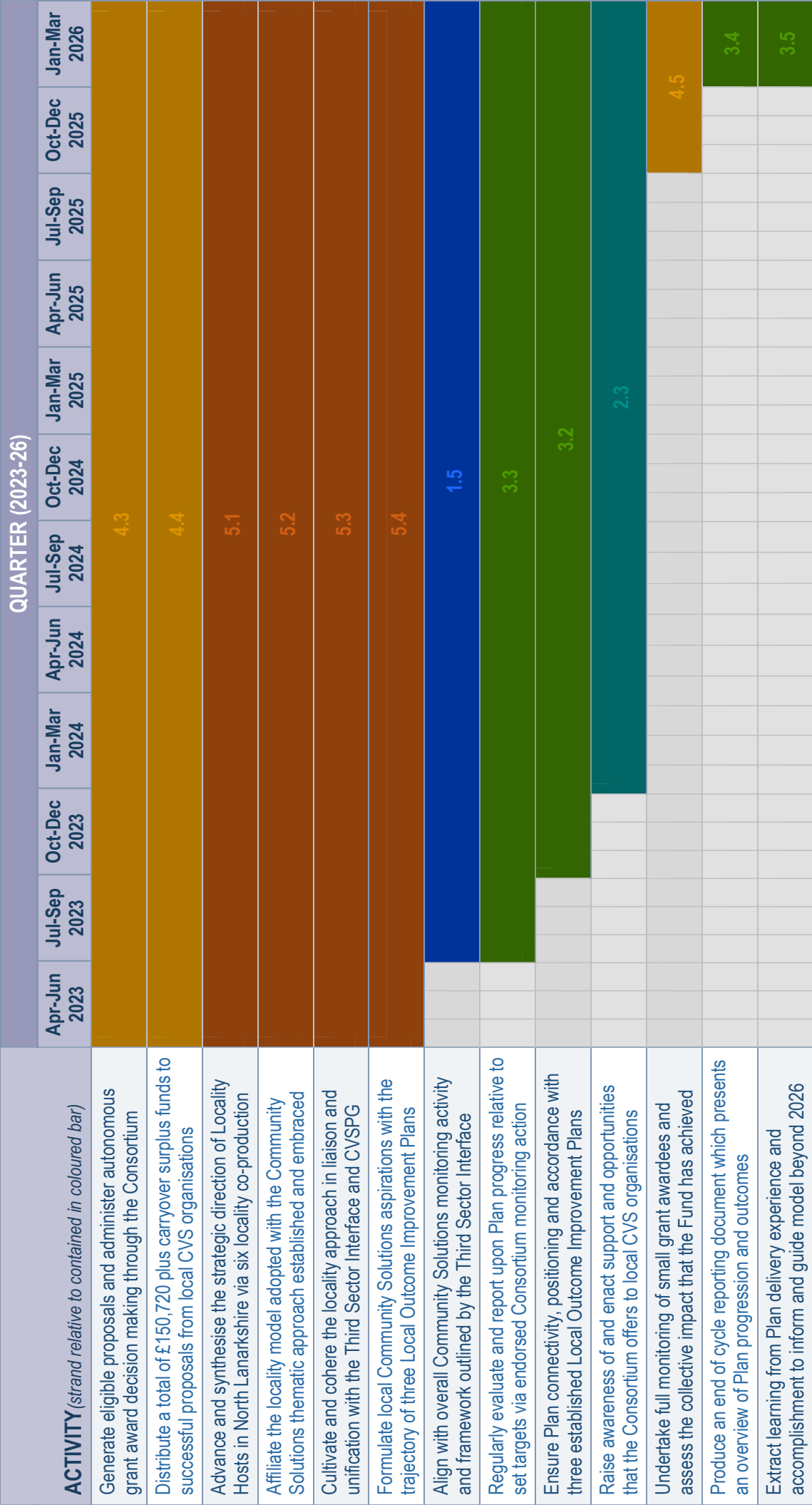
